

BRATHWAITE RECEIVES ALUMNI AWARD

The Paula Jo Carpenter Alumni Service Award has been created to honor the Georgia Christian School alum who exemplifies the following characteristics: service to the school, a love for its history as well as for its current students, and a commitment to ensuring its mission continues into the future. The award was named after Paula Jo because she embodied those qualities. Most of her academic career was spent right here at Georgia Christian. She left Dasher only to attend college, then returned here to teach for the entirety of her career, which was cut tragically short due to cancer.

The recipient of the 1st Annual Paula Jo Carpenter Alumni Service Award could not illustrate those characteristics more brilliantly. A 1983 graduate of Georgia Christian, he was a dorm kid to whom Dasher was more than just a school, it was home. Like Paula Jo, he, too, left Dasher to attend college, then returned here to teach. In a 2014 letter sent to alumni and friends, he said, "Having been a Christian for only two years before coming to the school, those four years [at Georgia Christian] also gave me the foundation of what it meant to be a disciple of Christ. Georgia Christian School has been the one constant factor in my life; it has been an anchor and a lighthouse; a reason for hope and faith. Faith in the knowledge that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28).

Mr. Jorge Brathwaite taught History, Government, and Economics at Georgia Christian from 1990 to 2015. It was through his efforts that the soccer program at Georgia Christian began and flourished and he continues to work with it as an assistant coach with Coach Colson and to help out regularly with the Turf class and the upkeep of the football and soccer field. It is our privilege to award the 1st Annual Paula Jo Carpenter Alumni Service Award to Mr. Jorge Brathwaite.
