

## And the Winner Is... **GCS Alumni Challenge**

Thank you to all of the GCS Alumni who gave as part of the GCS Alumni Challenge! It was a lot of fun, and we are closer than ever to our fundraising goal for the new high school.

There were a total of twenty-seven donations to the Alumni Challenge, and most of them far exceeded the \$100 goal. The total amount raised for the challenge was \$4,600. Two of the donations were designated as memorials.

The very first decade to participate in the Challenge was the 2010's. The very last decade to participate in the Challenge was the 1960's. Nearly every decade between the 1940's to present-day participated.

Now for the news that everyone has been waiting for, the greatest percentage participation by decade. We calculated the percent participation by the total number of class members who participated divided by the total number of class members who could have potentially participated, based on our current data. We wanted to allow both smaller and larger classes the chance to win the Alumni Challenge.

With 4% of the total alumni from their decade participating. the 1960's is the winner of the Alumni Challenge! We also received the greatest total number of donations and total dollar amount from the 1960's for the Alumni Challenge! Thank you to everyone who participated.
