

# DAY OF CARING CAPS OFF A SEASON OF SERVICE PROJECTS

Our recent Day of Caring for Georgia Christian's Junior and Senior classes has capped off a season of service projects in our community. After a chapel service in which they read about how Jesus washed his apostles' feet, they went to Second Harvest of South GA and packed over 800 boxes of food for senior citizens.

But this is just the latest example of students serving others. In their "Random Act of Kindness" project the week prior, Interact students baked and delivered cookies



to the Lowndes County Sheriff's Office, Valdosta Police Department, and the Valdosta Fire Department.

The service did not stop there!
The Valdosta Rotary Club Program in January was Hunger Fight, which packed over 17 million meals for hungry children in South Georgia and North Florida. After the program, several Rotarians and members of the GCS and VECA Interact Clubs packed some meals, too! Around 2500 meals were put together for local hungry children, putting into practice the Rotary/Interact motto of Service Above Self!
